GENERAL REPORT 2014–15

I submit for your approval at the 68th Annual General Meeting of the Ormond Cricket Club, the Annual Report and Statement of Income and Expenditure for season 2014-2015.

If you remember, I submitted in the annual report last year that the committee and the coaching staff of the Ormond Cricket Club are working towards the goal of premiership success.

Well after 40 long hard years, that goal was finally reached on the afternoon of Saturday 28th March 2015, when Rod Bird delivered the final ball of the VSDCA 1st XI South East Grand Final v Oakleigh at EE Gunn Reserve in front of a huge crowd that has not been seen at Ormond for either cricket or football in a long time and the rest, as they say, is history.

The wild scenes of celebration that followed will be remembered for a very long time, the ground invasion from the outer wing from our excited junior playing groups after the final ball, the tearful expressions of joy shown on the faces of club stalwarts Ian Shields, John Craig, Russell Oaten and Michael Williams and the scene in the rooms with the players, committee members, supporters and the general playing group together as one singing the club song, loud and proud.

What was also very special about these celebrations, was that the 1st XI players were joined in the team circle by the club's other premiership team, the Under 14A's who went undefeated for the season, who were christened the "Invincibles" by Pat Camm at the start of the season.

And what a season it was.....

As pre-season training commenced, there were some changes to the Executive Committee with President Michael Williams, stepping down from the role, due to pressing work commitments and the Presidency being taken over by Brian Ambler. In addition, Alistair Gordon stepped down from the role of Junior Co-Ordinator to spend more time watching and supporting his son Scott and was replaced by Pat Camm.

The departure of Alistair along with Geoff Cowen and Richard Simon from the Executive Committee last season, saw Ian Shields return after an absence of several years and he was joined by new committee members, John Crofts and Adam Reed.

The role of coach for the J.G. Craig (formerly R.M. Hatch) Under 15 representative team also changed hands from Darren Stait after a long and successful stint, to a new member of the senior playing group, Michael Cove.

There was also changes in the senior playing structure, with Coach Dale Christie introducing a player pathway, whereby the 3rd XI



became the Development XI for our junior players. The strategy was to provide the talented juniors with valuable exposure to playing senior cricket at a higher level in preparation for a smoother transition into playing seconds and ultimately 1st XI cricket for the club in the future. Therefore the 4th XI became the Club XI, for those senior players wanting to continue playing a good standard of cricket without the pressure of having to train weekly and not looking to press for selection in the higher XI's.

The individual highlights for the season will be covered in more detail in the following captains and managers' reports, but this is the time for me to thank all those responsible for making season 2014-2015 so memorable:

• President Brian Ambler, who took on the role and quite frankly was born to be President of the Ormond Crick-

SENIORS REPORT 2014–15

The following is a brief summary of season 2014-15 for each of the four senior XIs:-

FIRST XI REPORT 2014-15

Well, what a season it was for the Ormond CC 1st X1 in 2014/15. After 40 years in the wilderness, the First XI won the South/East Group Premiership in what most people would consider a massive upset. But we didn't consider it to be. We had the cattle to do it, we just had to play our best cricket and we managed to do that for three consecutive weeks.

Our journey started way back in October and we had a good start to the season with wins over Box Hill and Brighton. JB got his maiden 50 and 5 for in First XI cricket in the same game. A great effort from a very talented young player. Round 3 was a washout against Malvern after a promising start by Matt Thomas and our skipper, Rohan Wight. We were 0/80 off 8 overs when the final annoying rain shower came through and ruined our day. This was followed by a disappointing loss to Endeavour Hills. For that game we had a few senior players missing from the side which gave a few of the younger players of the squad a taste of First XI cricket. In the side we had Scott Gordon (16), Michail Schneider (16) and Jonty Sharman-Smith(18). I really hope these young lads enjoyed the experience and work hard on their games so that they can be a permanent part of our first XI for many years to come.



Round 5 and 6 saw us have a good wins against Mt Waverley and Kingston Saints respectively. Grant Chessari's 110 against Kingston Saints was one of the best centuries you will ever see in an Ormond shirt. He showed all his class and made batting look easy on a very tricky wicket. While other batsmen in the side took a while to get going, he hit every ball in the middle and it was a pleasure to watch. We are very lucky to have someone of Cheeso's ability and class in our side.

Round 7 was a disappointing loss to our rivals Caulfield in the final game before the Christmas Break. We restricted the powerful Caulfield batting line up to 6/170 off their 45 overs. We lost Wighty to a weird injury while in the field. After getting Caulfield opener Peter Cross out, Wighty jumped up in celebration and managed to twinge his calf in the process. Wighty was on the floor rolling around in pain clutching his calf and asking if Apples had spiked his calf. "I wasn't anywhere near you mate" chuckled Apples. In response, we were positioned well at 1/80 at drinks but a steady loss of wickets saw us make only 9/154 off our 45 overs. A below par performance by the team, especially when we were in a winning position.

So, at Christmas we were 4 wins, 2 losses and 1 no result. We were still in the top 6 so we would have taken that position.

The first game after Christmas saw us take on last year's East/West Group Premier, Noble Park. After Armageddon was forecasted by all weather channels, I decided to spring a last minute surprise for my wife and fly over to NZ for a wedding. After getting a text from Chippa and Wighty that there hadn't been a drop of rain South-East of Melbourne, the guys played the full 45 over one-dayer. How bad do you think I was feeling? The boys bowled first and welcomed in our overseas import Richard Stanyon. The text from Chippa advised "Jeez he is quick but a little bit erratic". After dropping Noble Park's star player, and eventual joint Val Holten Medallist, Issy Perera four times the home team made 6/233 off their 45 overs. In reply, we could only manage 143. The only contributors were 43 from captain of the day Cheeso and 57 from Davey Dervan. Not a good first up game after the break for the boys.

The next two games saw us have two good wins against Croydon and Moorabbin. Croydon was an enthralling contest when both sides could have won easily in first innings and then when Croydon set us a generous outright target of 115 off 19 overs on a tricky wicket. We just fell short at 6-106 off 19 overs. A great two days of cricket.

Bottom side Moorabbin nearly beat us but a great cameo from Richard Stanyon got us over the line 9 down. We had Moorabbin 6/60 but a great captain's innings of 64 from Shaun Williams and crucial runs from lower order batters Kennedy and Lee got the Binners to 206. We got off to a good start with Cheeso and Wighty both getting 30 each

before a steady flow of wickets saw us in a tricky situation at 7/153. Stanners and Mikki Schneider put on 40 for the 8th wicket before Mikki was out with 16 runs to get. His 13 runs were crucial. Stanners then struck some lofty blows to get us to 8/205 before he was out with two runs to win. Chippa and Birdy then got us over the line 9 down. A "Get Out of Jail Free" card was handed to us.

Round 11 saw us visit Elsternwick Park to take on the Wickers. Cheeso and Wighty got us off to our customary start with 90 before Cheeso was out for 43. Another quick wicket brought myself to the crease and with Wighty, we put on a good partnership to see us to 2/225 before Wighty got out for a well compiled 111. From there we were 2-20 and then quickly 9-40. Two big hits from Coach Chippa saw us reach an embarrassing 51 all out inside 22 overs. We bowled our hearts out to dismiss Oakleigh for 173. Our second innings didn't fair much better and we were bowled out for 109. Only Cheeso with 44 could really say that they batted well. We had hit rock bottom. The only way is up from here.

Our last round saw us play Bayswater away in a must win match to guarantee a finals berth. Both teams needed to win to make sure they were playing finals. We were still 3rd on the ladder but could slip out if we lost and other teams below us won. Wighty won the toss and had no hesitation in batting. We were quickly 4-25 after some good bowling and some questionable decisions went against us. Dervo walked to the crease and dug out a full ball that flew out to 2nd slip. Bayswater were going bananas as they thought that they had Ormond 5/25 and one foot into finals. The standing umpire thought that it was a bump ball. Dervo made the most of the let off and batted with authority and purpose to finish with a crucial 62 off 76 balls. I was out next ball to reduce us to 6-124 but a quick-fire 24 from Stanners got us to 154. Bayswater got to 3/80 before Dervo came back on to bowl and got rid of the dangerous Ben Osborne. Chippa then came back on and got Blair Allan for 38 to leave Bayswater 5/117. Birdy came back on to do what he does best and that is finish off the tail. Birdy took 3 quick wickets and Chippa the other one to bowl out Bayswater for 137. A great performance by Chippa with 4/22 off 9 and Birdy finishing with 3/17 off 4.5 overs. Dervo had a great game with his 62 and 3/30.

The 'Monders' finished the regular season in 3rd position and earned the right to play finals for the third year in a row. Our plan as a coaching group is in motion but not quite there.

In the finals series, we knew that if we batted well our bowling would look after itself. After making 256, 235 and 248 we always backed our bowlers in to do the job. And boy, didn't they do the job. The whole final series was a team effort and we played our best cricket when it counted. JB's catch in the Semi Final against Malvern was the best catch I have ever seen live. Freakish catch and was a turning point in their innings. It was particularly pleasing to see our Captain, Rohan Wight step it up during the Finals Series and led from the front in every aspect. Our bowling group of Chippa, Dervo, Birdy, Stanners, Smooth and myself also stood up when it counted. This was also backed up by our fielders. Tanks run out of Oakleigh's captain sparked the best celebration in a while. Nobody could catch the big fella. The fastest the big fella has ever run! Birdy's performance in the Grand Final will go down in history as one of the greatest spells anyone has bowled for the Ormond Cricket Club. To see him lift when a 1000 screaming fans were chanting his name at the Gunn will always stay with me. I was lucky to be bowling at the other end when all this was going on. It certainly lifted our players.

To all the players of the Premiership side, thank you for being part of one of the greatest days of my life. You blokes will be mates for life and we will cherish this moment for the rest of our lives.

To blokes who missed out on being in the side on the day, thank you for being part of the ride to success:

- Chris Appleton if it wasn't for your bravery in the last round of the season keeping with a broken finger, we may never have won this Premiership. That will go down as one of the most courageous performances I have ever seen. I feel for you buddy but it was great to see you celebrate so hard for us.
- Nick Oaten and Adam Reed who bowled the house down for the first 6 rounds of the season. Very unlucky to

SECOND XI REPORT 2014–15

Where last season's mantra from 2nd XI Captain Russell Oaten was 'Wickets, Wickets, Wickets, my kingdom for some wickets!' Season 2014/15 the leadership groups mantra was 'Please score some more runs ... please!'

In season 2013/14, the 2nd XI had a very potent batting line up, where runs flowed easily and frequently. However, in season 2014/15 runs were a struggle and at times very costly with agonisingly close losses to Mount Waverley, Croydon and Elsternwick where we were bowled sides out for less than 145 on all 3 occasions, only to lose each game by a single wicket.

Statistically our batting department was down almost 700 runs on the prior season and unfortunately this cost the side the opportunity to play finals in 2014/15.

Our strength this season was undoubtedly our bowling. As a 2^{nd} XI we took 122 wickets for the season (3^{rd} in the group behind Malvern with 128), this was up on the 77 taken in the previous season.

Our end result of 4 wins for the season, with two of those outright victories over Moorabbin and Kingston Saints, was soured by the loss of 12 points due to an administrative oversight from the club. This deduction of points reduced us to 12th position on the table, but I believe it is not indicative of the performances and potential of the squad we had playing in the 2nd XI this season.

As with previous years, the 2nd XI was a predominantly young squad. There were games this season where we only had two players over the age of 20 in the side (lucky these games were close to Ormond), but I assume that this was a much easier task than what Cam Scott had with our Development XI this season.

The side has had some remarkable team performances to start the season with all its victories being against fellow South group sides Brighton, Malvern, Kingston Saints & Moorabbin.

Some team highlights of note:

- Back to Back victories over Brighton and Malvern we would have to go back in the record books to see the last time this happened at Ormond.
- Three bowling innings where the side has restricted the opposition to less than 100 runs (Brighton & Kingston Saints both innings).
- Outright victories over Kingston Saints & Moorabbin

- Adam Reed with his 6 wicket haul in the first innings against Moorabbin
- Nick Oaten with his first Senior 5 wicket haul in the second innings against Moorabbin
- James Bartholomeusz for his maiden Senior Century which set up the outright victory against Moorabbin.
- Miles Sellenger aged 13 for making his 2nd XI debut against premiers Oakleigh in Rd 12.

Congratulations to the Average Winners in Vignesh Sundaramoorthi in the batting (199 runs @ 33) and Tom Stait in the bowling (19 wickets @ 12.2).

I would like to Congratulate Dale Christie, Rohan Wight and the entire 1st XI squad on their Premiership success. We as a club have been waiting a very long time for this, and the joy that you have brought to this club and everyone that

FOURTH XI REPORT 2014–15

I would have to say in all my years playing at Ormond, season 2014–2015 would have to be one of the most enjoyable seasons I have played at the club, due to the great teamwork, friendship and camaraderie displayed by all those who played in the 4th XI for the season.

JUNIOR SECTION REPORT

Overview

The Junior Section of the club fielded nine sides this season with 104 registered players. We had seven teams playing in the under age South East Cricket Association (SECA) with two sides in the Under 12's, three in the Under 14's and two teams in the Under 16's. In addition, we fielded two teams in the T20 Blast program run by Cricket Victoria (CV).

It was a very successful season with three of our under age teams playing finals and the highlight of the season was an Under 14 A grade premiership. This team was labeled the 'invincibles' at the start of the season and lived up to that reputation going through the entire season undefeated. Unfortunately, both our under 14B and under 16A teams had narrow losses in their semi finals. The remaining teams were all competitive which suggests they were appropriately graded.

Some of the teams had 13 players and the challenge was to provide each player with relatively even opportunities to bat and bowl. In the lower age groups (below under 14A) the association enforce equal participation rules. At the junior level we have been trying to develop a point of difference compared to other clubs and this season we carried forward some initiatives from last season including:

- One-on-one coaching sessions on Sunday mornings
- Thanks to sponsors (Omegapharm and P J Camm & Associates) each player received a club coloured training shirt and a white playing shirt
- Every player received a new training ball
- We introduced a winter program using an electronic bowling machine to fast track the development of some of the under 14 and 16 players
- Membership subscription included membership of the Melbourne Stars in the Big Bash League.



Under 16s

Ormond fielded two very competitive sides in the U16 competition. Our U16A Grade team finished fourth on the ladder at the end of the home and away season while our Under 16B team finished sixth on the ladder. Unfortunately, the Under 16A team lost their semi-final to top team Elwood. The good news is around half of the squad remain eligible to play under 16 again next season. It was also pleasing to see a number of these boys playing senior cricket this season with several making their debut in our first XI.

Under 14s

We fielded three sides this season, one in A, B and C grade. Our U14A grade team went through the season undefeated which is an outstanding achievement given it is a very strong competition. The team in B grade only lost one game during the home and away season (by a single run) and were desperately unlucky to lose their semi final. Our team in C grade also did an extraordinary job given they lost several players due to injury at the start of the season and each week the team contained five or six under 12 players. Their development and improvement was a real highlight of the junior season.

Under 12s

Our two Under 12 sides represented Ormond in B grade and D grade this season. Our B grade team were very young and inexperienced but their development was really impressive. The D grade team competed in the 'rookies' section and the group made great progress. The camaraderie and spirit amongst both of the under 12 teams was outstanding and they really enjoyed their season of cricket. While both teams finished in the lower half of the ladder they have built a solid platform to progress to higher grades in 2015/16. There are some very talented players in our under 12 ranks and the future looks promising.

<u>T20 Blast</u>

Ormond fielded 16 players in two sides in the T20 Blast competition run at Koornang Park in Carnegie. This is the third year of the program and provides a great pathway between Milo In2Cricket and hard ball under 12 junior cricket. The format of game is very much like Kanga Cricket, where the larger oval is divided up into six small grounds. The focus is on participation and there are no competition ladders. These young children are on track to take the next step and join our under 12 teams next season.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2014/15

It is with great pride that I am able to present the Treasurer's report following a premiership victory.

And it is with further pride that, following the loss of \$7,684 in the prior year, the Ormond Cricket Club is reporting a profit of \$4,543 for season 2014/15. It should be noted that this is the first profitable season since 2009/10.

It should be further noted that both the current year and prior year losses include a non-cash write-down in the value of equipment on hand of \$1,833 and \$763 respectively.

Following the prior year loss, the Club identified a need to increase its fundraising efforts if it was to return to a profitable or break-even position. An increase in subscriptions received from players along with substantially greater returns from social and fundraising and sponsorship and donations were the result of a dedicated effort on the part of those involved. Furthermore, the Club was fortunate to have received over \$2,000 in prizemoney from both its premiership victory as well as from a Melbourne Stars competition.

As mentioned in the prior year report, Cricket Victoria has made a decision to phase out its financial support of Sub-District clubs via its annual dividend. This culminated in the dividend reducing to \$9,000.

Overall, cricket club expenditure was increased in season 2014/15 by \$9,993, predominantly due to increases in junior program expenses, merchandise and honoraria, offset by the one-off nature of the prior season charge for re-keying the pavilion.

A significant asset purchase was made during the season, with \$7,150 being the cricket club's contribution towards the new electronic scoreboard situated at the EE Gunn Reserve.

Ormond Cricket Club enjoys a strong ongoing relationship with its sponsors, and the financial contributions of Omegapharm, Buxton Real Estate, Hewett Racking Systems, Linen House, PJ Camm & Associates, Australian Urology Associates, The Door Store and CMS International deserve to be highlighted. The Club also wishes to thank the players who made the extra effort to obtain individual sponsors this season. Furthermore, the Club would like to note the strong relationship it has built with the local Ormond/McKinnon branch of the Bendigo Community Bank, for which it is an investor. This ownership interest has already paid off via the sponsorship funds which have been received since the relationship commenced.

I would like to acknowledge the support of John Craig and Mathew Cousins in administering the Club's financial matters.

As mentioned earlier, the investment by the Ormond Cricket Club over the past three seasons in its cricket operations has resulted in the ultimate on-field success. The current year profitable result is a reward for effort both on and off the field, however the prior seasons' sustained financial losses should serve as a harsh reminder that we should not become complacent and that there is much hard work ahead if the Club is to build on this improved position in future seasons.
