CLUB HISTORY

At the completion of the 2020/21 season Ormond Cricket Club has played in over 930 games in the Victorian Sub District Cricket Association (VSDCA) and is in its 112th year as a cricket club.

Formed in 1903 Ormond's first three matches were played against Caulfield Grammar, Melbourne Sports Depot and Prahran Bohemians. The first captain was F A Looker and the initial president was most likely E Burman and the first season was played in the Brighton Moorabbin CA which soon merged to become the Brighton and District Cricket Association.



In total the club has won 29 senior premierships and 32 junior flags, overall 61. The first premiership was in 1908/09 when a new Christ Church minister C H Raymond who was completing his training arrived and went on to make 3 centuries in that season including 144 in the Grand Final. Just as importantly it was said his cricketing prowess improved church attendances.

Hard times fell on the club in 1912 when the lack of players and a ground meant the club disbanded early in the season. With WW1 imminent the club was like many others, not in a position to reform.

Immediately after the war, in 1919 Ormond was back playing in the Brighton and District CA. Three important events occurred in the next decade. Following a community petition for a recreational ground in 1921, plans were drawn up in 1923 for Ormond Park and Ormond CC was playing there by the mid twenties. Within a year or two the cricket club made representation to Caulfield Council for a pavilion and this was accepted as the club took responsibility for its construction. Ormond joined the Frankston Glenhuntly CA during this period and a new club soon to become fierce rivals, Ormond Park CC emanating from the Uniting Church emerged to play on the adjoining ground.

At the beginning of the 1930s Ormond again moved competitions as it joined the Caulfield and Districts CA where its senior teams played for the next 17 years. The club enjoyed premiership success during the WW2 period. A famous name appeared among the playing list in the early thirties, Ernest Gunn who by the end of the decade was already a leading club figure and for the following twenty five years lead the club as president until his retirement in 1970. Gunn also played a leading role with the Ormond Football Club and was a two term Caulfield Council mayor and in 1964 Ormond Park was renamed E E Gunn Reserve in recognition of his contribution.

It was Gunn who along with other key figures who recognised that Ormond and Ormond Park should not be diluting the local cricketing talent and with the introduction of turf cricket a possibility merging the clubs would benefit all parties. The name would remain Ormond CC, Gunn would be the new president and the new entity would take the blue and gold colours of Ormond Park.

Ormond enjoyed immediate success in the Victorian Junior Cricket Association (now VTCA) winning two 1st eleven premierships in 1947/48 and 1948/49. In 1949 the club joined the VSDCA where it has played for the next 71 years. Gradually, as more turf wickets were laid at Gunn Reserve all senior sides moved from the CDCA to play in VSDCA and VJCA turf competitions. After initial struggles, two VSDCA premierships were secured in the late fifties before the club's golden decade when it won six Championships from 1965/66 until 1974/75 with club legends Colin Hyland, John Craig and Ted Plant a part of all six victories (also Mike Patterson And Alan Doble who both played in five). Not unsurprisingly the club had a very strong junior platform and secured many junior successes during this time.

There have been lean periods and it was 40 years before the club's latest 1st XI premiership was won in 2014/15. For a period in the 1980s junior teams diminished to an alarmingly low level and little club success followed. Currently, Ormond CC is enjoying a strong period of growth with the first XI team appearing in finals for six of the past nine seasons and the junior program servicing twelve teams along with pre competition development.

ORMOND CRICKET CLUB 'FAMILY GAMES' TOTALS

The following is a list of games by families for the Ormond Cricket Club. It must be stressed that these game tallies are based on available club records. This would affect the totals of some families whose individual contributions began prior to records being kept or where scorebooks/annual reports for some early seasons have been lost. Eg...George Scott began playing for Ormond around 1942/43, however our club records only record his Ist XI games from 1949 and do not include his games in other teams until 1953.

Pre WW2, notable families who began a very long association with Ormond were the Chapman, Rowse, Christian & Hallows families.

VALE DON CHISHOLM

(06/01/1930 - 20/09/2020)

Ormond Cricket Club acknowledges with sadness the passing of legend Don Chisholm (OAM) on 20th September after a short illness.

Don was aged 92 years and he was a Life Member and Hall of Fame Club Legend. He was one of the most influential members in Ormond's 111 year history combining a fine playing career with an outstanding record of club leadership.

Don joined Ormond Cricket Club from Melbourne University as a player in 1952/53 and over the next 23 seasons he played 238 senior matches. His debut in the 1st XI saw him take 7/73 with his well flighted leg spinners. Don played 31 1st XI matches and in 1957/58 he was vice-captain of the 3rd XI premiership team and in the semi-final against Sandringham he dominated making 80 runs and claiming seven wickets. Don's stylish batting, consistency and all round ability saw him win the club championship twice as well as finishing both second and third twice.



Don was the winner of eight bowling and batting averages including two 2nd XI batting averages. Twice he took more than fifty wickets in a season and he also played football with OAFC and was the Clubs leading goal kicker in 1948. A knee injury curtailed his football career and also impacted significantly on his cricket career.

Don claimed a unique hat trick in the later part of his playing career. The hat trick was taken over three overs. The first wicket was with the final ball of his second last over, then first ball of his next over closed the innings. He completed the hat trick with his first delivery in the opposition's second innings.

Don's leadership was not confined to captaining multiple Ormond sides. In 1957 he joined the club committee and in 1961 he became vice-president. For much of that time he was actually taking responsibility for leading the club as President Ernie Gunn had a multitude of Caulfield (Glen Eira) Council and community responsibilities. This was a most successful period for Ormond Cricket Club.

In 1971 Don became President, a position he held for 16 years before retiring in 1986 having spent 34 years with the club. Whilst these were largely halcyon days for the club, it did require outstanding leadership to complement the playing success. Don was a strategic planner, using his network to recruit fine people to the club and was also an excellent delegator. Don always remained close to the Council and Ormond flourished under his tenure. Many older members would remember being invited to social functions at Lynette and Don's house.

Away from Ormond, Don had many interests and significant community involvement. He became Managing Partner of the legal practice Maddock Lonie and Chisholm and continued practising well past "normal" retirement age. In addition, he spent considerable time supporting the disadvantaged and disabled, being a board member of VATMI (an agency supporting the disabled and mentally impaired) and he had a special relationship with the Port Phillip Special School. It was for his work in this area that Don was awarded an Order of Australia Medal in 2007. He was also president of Murrumbeena Secondary College and with his legal background acted as the Ormond Football Club's legal advisor. He had a keen interest is farming and bred Charolais cattle at his property in the Western District.

In recent years Don developed a passionate interest in horse racing and owned several successful thoroughbred and standardbred (trotting) horses.

It was very fitting that Don was among the inaugural Hall of Fame Legend inductees in 2017. Ormond has had many families with a long connection to the club and the Chisholm family is one such family with family members playing a combined total of 585 senior matches. Sons Andrew, John and Rod plus grandson Robert all played for the club. Andrew who captained the 1st XI and Rod who was the lst XI wicket keeper both played for Ormond for virtually two decades. Like their father, they each won a club championship.

Ormond Cricket Club was very fortunate to have had Don as the club leader. He established and led a culture that enabled the club to flourish both on and off the field. On behalf of the club, we pass on our sincere condolences to Lynette, John, Andrew, Rodney, Michael and the wider Chisholm family.

SECRETARY'S REPORT 2020/21

To the Members, Players and Supporters of the Ormond Cricket Club

I submit for your approval at the 74th Annual General Meeting of the Ormond Cricket Club, the Annual Report and Statement of Income and Expenditure for season 2020/2021.

Well if you thought last season was an extraordinary season for the club, well think again. Season 2020/2021 was truly quite remarkable and possibly one of the best seasons the club has had both on and off the field for quite some time.

If you had asked me this time last year that we would have the season starting in November and have a full thirteen round season, plus finals, I would have told you that you might need to go and have a COVID test, because it was looking like there would be no season at all, with the possibility of maybe, just maybe starting the season in January and be all over in less than 3 months.

How very fortunate we were.

A full thirteen round one day season for the seniors, plus the re-introduction of the 5th XI, a full season for all our junior sides and four senior teams making finals, with the 4th XI only just missing out by a game and percentage, hosting the 1st XI grand final at EE Gunn Reserve and the club posting an operating profit.

During the pre-season the club welcomed new recruit Sachin Varadarajan from Premier Cricket Club, St. Kilda, as well as the return of Grant Chessari, who took over the captaincy of the 2nd XI.

The 1st XI, led by new captain Ben Speake, finished the home and away season in 5th place with 8 wins against Croydon, Moorabbin, Elsternwick, Box Hill, Malvern, Endeavour Hills, Mount Waverley, and Balwyn. The five losses unfortunately came against our local rivals Brighton, Caulfield, and Oakleigh, with the remaining losses against Bayswater and Noble Park.

However, come finals time, the 1st XI reversed the ledger by having fantastic away wins against Caulfield in the qualifying final and an even greater win against Brighton in the semi-final. This meant we hosted the final at EE Gunn Reserve against Caulfield. Unfortunately, our fairytale end to the season didn't eventuate with Caulfield easily accounting for us.

As a result of the strong performance shown by the 1st XI, this resulted in the club having Captain Ben Speake making the VSDCA Team of the Year as the wicketkeeper along with the evergreen fast bowler Rod Bird.

The 2nd XI, lead by Grant Chessari, finished the home and away season in 5th place with 9 wins against, Croydon, Moorabbin, Elsternwick, Box Hill, Endeavour Hills, Mount Waverley, Balwyn, Caulfield, and Noble Park. The four losses unfortunately were against finalists Oakleigh, Bayswater, Brighton and Malvern. This resulted in the 2nd XI, having to travel to our local rivals Brighton for the Qualifying Final where unfortunately the lads couldn't get the job done and exited the finals.

The 3rd XI, were again captained by club legend Russell Oaten and finished the home and away season in 4th place, with 8 wins against Elsternwick, Bayswater, Oakleigh, Box Hill, Malvern, Balwyn, Caulfield and Noble Park, 2 draws/ wash outs against Brighton and Endeavour Hills and three losses against Croydon, Moorabbin and Mount Waverley. This led to the 3rd XI hosting the qualifying final at EE Gunn Reserve against Moorabbin but were up against a very strong and talented Moorabbin side and exited the finals.

The 4th XI had co-captains, Chris Roach and Jack Rogers. The 4th XI finished the home and away season in 8th place with 6 wins against Croydon, Moorabbin, Elsternwick, Oakleigh, Balwyn and Noble Park, a tie against Mount Waverley, which came down to the final ball, a draw against Endeavour Hills and 5 losses against Bayswater, Box Hill (another last ball game!!), Brighton, Malvern and Caulfield. As mentioned earlier the 4th XI missed out on the finals by a game and percentage.

The re-introduction of the 5th XI, which played in a Saturday one-day competition in SECA and played their home game at Lords Reserve No 3 Oval, was well lead by captain Darren Seymour. The 5th XI finished the home and away season in 3rd place with 5 wins against Hampton Central (twice), Le Page Park (twice), and Cluden. 2 draws against Carnegie South and Omega and 3 losses against Mackie, CUCC Kings and Highett West. This meant the 5th XI, played their semi-final away against Highett West and unfortunately were unable to progress to the Grand Final.

The JG Craig Under 15 representative side, brought home the first of three premierships for the club in season 2020/2021 and were again well led by coach Michael Cove and ably assisted by his young and enthusiastic assistant coaches in Joel Fernando, Lukas Galanopoulos and Brett Poll. The JG Craig team went through the tournament undefeated and played off in the final at Elsternwick against the only other undefeated team in the competition in Plenty Valley, where the young Monders won the final very convincingly.

Our junior section also had a fantastic season, where we fielded 2 Under 16 sides, 4 Under 14 sides (with 2 Ormond teams in the same grade), 4 Under 12 sides and 2 Under 12 Rookie sides.

The juniors had 8 of these sides make finals with Grand Final victories by the Under 16A side, Under 14 A side and unfortunately, we couldn't get the SECA triple crown with the Under 12A side losing the grand Final by 9 runs. The Under 16C side made the semi-final, the Under 14B side making a semi-final, the Under 14C No.2 side making the semi-final and the Under 12B and Under 12C sides making semi-finals.

The highlights across the club's senior and junior XI's for the season will be covered in more detail in the team season results as well as the captains and managers' reports. I would now like to thank all those responsible for making season 2020-2021 happen:

- President Pat Camm, who again did a magnificent job in leading the ship, especially this year through the stormy waters of COVID19. Pat has not been afraid again to make some significant and very important decisions for the future direction of the club.
- Tanja Curtis and Will Robertshaw for all your fantastic work in taking on the role of Junior Coordinator for this season. The amount of work the both of you did in the off-season to get the junior program underway during COVID19 lockdown period was extraordinary.
- Treasurer Liam Mulcahy, for continuing to do an excellent job in controlling the club's financial status, especially during this past 12 months during the COVID19 pandemic.
- Coach Murray Ring. Congratulations on your third year at the club. You have again done a great job in bringing the playing group together with your leadership and enthusiasm. This was been shown again with the club coming 9th in the VSDCA Club Championship and 8th in the Spirit of Cricket Award.
- 1st XI Captain Ben Speake. Congratulations on a great job in your first season as captain leading us into the grand final. In addition, your own performance with the bat and behind the stumps in making the VSDCA Team of the Year was exceptional.
- Michael Cove again for your excellent role of coaching the Under 15 Craig team and getting us back to the top of the mountain. It will be sad to see you leave the coaching post after 7 years and 3 premierships but we note you will mentor your replacement, Miles Sellenger.
- Phil Arnold for all the fantastic work you do with the Under 12 sides in developing them to play better and higher cricket.
- Geoff Cowen our Club historian for his excellent work in restoring and updating the club records plus managing

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2020/21



2020/21 was an extraordinary season. In fact, we were very fortunate to play any cricket given the backdrop of COVID-19, a once in century global pandemic.

We will look back on season 2020/21 and reflect on the extraordinary challenges we faced as a club and community dealing with COVID-19. The devastating social impact and dire economic consequences of forcing businesses to close, stopping children going to school, keeping people locked in their homes and keeping family and friends apart have been well documented. COVID-19 hit our shores in March 2020 and forced the cancellation of all senior grand finals last season and the entire state of Victoria was in lockdown for months. The history books will report that the pandemic changed the way we live, work and play.

The state of Victoria only started to re-open in late October 2020 so preseason was compressed to just 3 weeks and players had to train in small hubs of between 10 and 12 people. With 5 senior teams and 12 junior teams this was a logistical nightmare. Necessity is the mother of invention so we developed a plan to train across both grounds at E E Gunn Reserve and set up work stations that offered different skill drills.



The directive from Cricket Victoria and the government was, "get in, train and get out" so there was no social interaction between the groups and we had to enforce strict social distancing rules. The committee should be acknowledged for their detailed planning and every player should be congratulated for complying with the safety guidelines.

The start of cricket season was delayed until late November and the season for both junior and senior teams was reduced with teams playing exclusively one day games. Membership subscriptions were reduced because the abbreviated season and the club couldn't host social functions or operate the bar prior to Christmas. Unfortunately, most of our sponsors were sent into hibernation or operating on a reduced capacity and I would like to acknowledge the financial support we received from our major sponsors including The Door Store, Omegapharm, Bendigo Bank and Cricket HQ. Despite all the obstacles, the club still posted a profit.

The club has been on an upward trajectory for the past 8 years and we continue to grow in numbers. This year we fielded a senior 5ths team in the SECA competition to cater for our growth plus also help transition some of our juniors into seniors. It was a great success and next season we are planning on fielding a 6th senior team if we can source a ground. We also hope to field a senior team in a Sunday competition if Glen Eira Council give us access to the main ground on Sundays. This growth is not an overnight success story, it is the result of a decade of hard work with our juniors who are now progressing through the system we have created.

ON FIELD

While it was an extraordinary season off the ground, on field produced some fantastic results. Last season, for the first time in 20 years we had two senior teams play finals (1s and 3s) and this season four senior teams played finals (1s, 2s, 3s and 5s). In fact, it was nearly 5 teams given our 4ths narrowly missed the top 6. Our first XI finished 5th on the ladder but produced two sensational wins in the finals against Caulfield and Brighton to host the grand final at E E Gunn. Unfortunately, Caulfield were too good for us on the day but the playing group can't wait for season 2021/22.

Special mention must go to our leaders, coach Murray Ring and new Club Captain, Ben Speake. Together with former club captain James Wild, they have created a positive and welcoming culture that has attracted a lot of new players to the club. Murray's contribution and impact cannot be understated and we now have a winning culture, players want to join the club and we have earned the respect of other VSDCA clubs and the board of management.

To all our captains, thank you. It's not easy managing on field and off field duties so to Ben Speake, Grant Chessari, Russell Oaten, Chris Roach and Darren Seymour congratulations on a job well



done. Thanks also to our Chairman of Selectors, Jacob 'Rowdy' Smith and first XI team manager and scorer, India Strauch. They go about their business each and every week without any fanfare and the Ormond machine works smoothly and efficiently because of their contribution.

JUNIORS

Underpinning our emerging senior squad is our long pipeline of talented juniors. They continue to filter into our senior sides and it's fair to say that our junior programme is now the envy of other SECA and VSDCA cricket clubs. We are a destination club for talented juniors.

Some outstanding junior results this year:

- For the third time in five years our Under 15 Craig team won the competition.
- 8 of a possible 9 junior teams played finals.
- We won the Under 14A Grade and Under 16 A Grade Premierships.
- Our Under 12A Grade team lost the grand final with four balls remaining and should we have won, it would have been the first time a club had won the SECA A grade junior triple crown.

Our junior programmes are not an overnight success story. They are a result of ten years of planning and hard work. The club has invested heavily in the juniors since our first XI won the 2014/15 premiership. We had a number of retirements at the end of that season and had to rely on junior players to fill senior teams. It was a challenging time and the results in our lower grades weren't encouraging. Fast forward a few seasons and the experience these talented juniors got on turf wickets is paying off. They have come of age and we are reaping the rewards.

The junior section of the club continues to grow and we have found the right balance between success, participation and fun. Appointing a number of senior players to coach our junior teams has proven a significant point of difference and a factor behind our sensational results in 2020/21. Several of the coaches were first XI players or former juniors who are now playing first XI cricket at Premier Clubs. It takes a lot of work to manage 12 junior teams and a huge thank you to Will Robertshaw who took on the important role as Junior Coordinator this year. He went above and beyond the call of duty by attending most junior training sessions and has also helped 'coach the coaches'.

Our results are a credit to these coaches from Junior Blasters right through to the Under 16's. These coaches are either senior players or former juniors who came through our system and are now giving back to the club. This policy of 'giving back' is part of our culture and in the past 5 seasons we have seen more than a dozen talented players move on to play Premier Cricket. I'm very confident that these young stars will gravitate back to the club at some stage and when they do, we will be a powerhouse. Special mention to James Bartholomeusz who managed the Under 16A Grade premiership team and both Miles Sellenger and Bailey Moon who co-coached the Under 14A Grade premiership team.

A big thank you to James Robertshaw, Ben Oaten and Senin Seymour for running our Woolworths Blasters Programmes. These are true grass root programmes and players feed into our Under 12 teams. A huge thank you to Tanja Curtis who again managed these growing programmes.

Thank you to Phil Arnold who took on the management of our large Under 12 group (7 teams). He was responsible for grading during the pre-season and managed training on Monday evenings which wasn't easy in a COVID environment. Phil also coached our Under 12A grade team to another grand final.

To Mick Cove, coach of our Under 15 J G Craig team for the past 7 years, a massive thank you. A large part of the club's resurgence is attributable to graduates of our Craig teams joining the club as senior players. Mick's preparation and commitment is unmatched by any other coach in the competition and sadly, we lose him next season to Premier Club Prahran. He has built a succession plan with several young coaches understudying his methods so we expect to be a force for years to come in a competition names after club legend John Craig. Special mention also to Senin Seymour who took out the Steve Ambler Memorial Award for his performances in the Craig team.

COMMITTEE

I need to pass on thanks to the committee for their work during the season. COVID-19 made the last year incredibly challenging and nearly all our committee meetings were held remotely via Zoom.

I could not do my job without the help and guidance of past president Brian Ambler. He commutes most weeks from Point Lonsdale and his support and intel are highly valued. Ian Shields is a tireless worker and fantastic sounding board. I have thoroughly enjoyed the journey and our key decisions were driven by my predecessor's (Brian Ambler) mantra of 'continuous improvement'. I am stepping down in the knowledge that the club is still on an upward trajectory and on the verge of a highly successful era.

COACH'S REPORT 2020/21

I believe my third season as coach of the club was a successful one. We earnt the right to hold our heads high, applaud our success and celebrate all the somewhat innovative occurrences at Ormond.

COACHING REPORT

- Our highest ever finish on the VSDCA Club Championship table
- 4 out of 5 senior teams made their respective finals (1's, 2's, 3's and 5's)
- Our First Eleven finishing runners-up to champions Caulfield
- This in combination with significant junior representation in both Grand Finals and premierships meant it was a year to remember.

I am extremely proud of the way we went about our cricket this season, the effort made by both players and volunteers throughout the year meant we were able to make our opportunities count in a COVID shortened/affected season. We faced challenges with an abbreviated pre-season, a staggered training schedule including numerous Covid -Safe protocols and a newly introduced One-Day Match format. All necessary if we wanted to resume our love of cricket.

Both the One-Day format and a surplus of playing numbers certainly added an extra challenge for myself and the selection committee. With limited overs, comes limited responsibility. I had countless conversations with players throughout the season begging for an opportunity either in higher grades or within their team, I apologise I couldn't facilitate all of your requests, but know that it wasn't due to a lack of thought. Though I understand that these conversations regarding selection and people management are key factors in a coaching role, the disappointment that must be delivered to people does take its toll, becoming quite taxing by seasons end. Our depth was another contributing factor to our strong results. On a regular basis I was surprised by the quality of teams we were naming, particularly in the lower grades, which was a welcome change to where we were at the beginning of my tenure in 2018. Not only was the introduction of new players a major reason for our depth improvement, but further development of youth also had an impact. 



SEASON REPORT

To say that this season was a strange one, is an understatement.

We have all now lived through a Global Pandemic and we will never be the same again. With COVID-19 causing an early end to the finals series last season, it also delayed the start of this season. We didn't start until the 21st of November and the season was reduced to all 40 over, one day games.

The 3rds entered the season looking to go a couple better than the previous season and with the return of Liam Jenkins, the full availability of James Robertshaw and the emergence of young guns Charlie Costa and Senin Seymour this seemed a realistic target. Our start to the season was a shock as we lost the first two 2 matches through poor batting performances. This was going to be a portent for the entire season as our batting overall was abysmal and that is being kind. We were only able to bat our 40 overs a few times and that obviously put pressure on our bowling and fielding.

The fact that we only had 2 players score 50 or more and only 4 players exceeded an aggregate of 100 runs for the season sums up our weakness. Our attack was spearheaded by Varun with 17 wickets and ably backed up by Ben who lead the wicket tally with 18 poles. FOURTH XI REPORT 2020/21

SEASON REPORT

After a season of growth in 2019/20 that saw the 4th XI begin to win games and get off the bottom of the ladder, this season the objective was to be more competitive and hopefully take the next step and play finals. While we wanted to win more games, we also wanted to ensure that we were developing our emerging juniors and provide a pathway to the higher grades. The interrupted pre-season due to the COVID-19 pandemic should be noted and every player and the committee should be acknowledged for their planning and efforts to comply with the government safety guidelines.

The overall results for the year were a mixed bag and we finished the year in 8th place with 6 wins, 5 losses, a tied game and a wash out. While the number of wins were the same as the 2019/20 season, the nature of the games lost was a vast improvement. The chance to actually win the game was present in all games, however, that ruthless edge that is required to win games was the only thing that let us down on some occasions. Several games slipped through our fingers which proved costly.

There is no doubt we learnt valuable lessons that will help the group win the tight games next season. There were glimpses of this development on show later in the year as evidenced by our tie with Mt. Waverly who needed just 2 runs off the last over to win. We held them to a draw thanks to the bowling efforts of Dylan Vesel and Nick Riley. I have no doubt that the trajectory the team is on will see us play finals next season. In fact, we should go deep into a finals campaign given the experience the group got this year plus the improvement in the emerging juniors.

We saw some really promising signs from the juniors coming through the club. A number of them went on to play higher grades which is a really good sign and the implementation of the fifth XI also helped to improve the standard set in the fourth XI as individuals knew they wouldn't be gifted games in the fours. Darren Seymour should also be acknowledged in his work in developing individuals through that fifth XI team that performed admirably when promoted.

Important moments throughout the season:-

- Ben Costa an Under 14 player in his first year of senior cricket recording 2 five wicket hauls and finishing with the most wickets in the team (14) and winning the bowling average despite missing a large portion through school cricket commitments. His confidence to keep flighting the ball up against some seasoned senior batsman was outstanding. He is destined for higher grades going forward.
- Charlie Wood (Under 14) his competitive nature in the Oakleigh game (round 4) shone through. With Oakleigh 0/55 and seemingly cruising towards victory he took it upon himself to get the first wicket which opened up the game and allowed us to win. For a young player at the start of his senior career to have the confidence to drive the team was impressive.
- Senin Seymour (Under 16) only played the first 2 games with us in the fourth eleven. However, in those two games he finished with a 5/13 (Round 2) and made 50 runs (only dismissed once). He displayed leadership qualities beyond his years and his performances in higher grades suggest he will secure a permanent place in our top 2 senior teams next season.
- Kovid Jayasuriya his 87 in round 3 was a very impressive innings.
- Charlie Costa had 2 innings with us for a total of 103 runs (averaging 51.5) and he is another one of emerging juniors on an upward spiral.
- Alex Christopoulos with an innings of 54 in round 10 against Mt. Waverly. He was also a contributor every week with the ball.
- Dylan Vessel has also continued to improve and has developed into a very capable all-round cricketer. I wouldn't be surprised if we have seen the last of him the fourth XI.
- Rishab Kiran should also be mentioned given he struggled early due to VCE studies and had a stint in the 5ths, however he didn't let that deter him and he managed to work his way back into the fours and his finish to the year was impressive winning the batting average (including an top score of 59).

• Firstly, to my co-captain Jack Rogers, thank you for guidance and being a great sounding board throughout the

- Club coach Murray Ring for helping me navigate through captaining a cricket side for the first time. It was so much easier with all the work you do behind the scenes. Also, the job you have done in getting the 'fours' and Ormond CC as a whole on this upward trajectory.
- Nick Riley Probably found himself playing in a lower grade than he expected at the start of the season but he just put his head down and worked hard. He was so reliable with the ball and his willingness to help me set fields and develop plans for batsmen was invaluable. Your encouragement of some of the younger fast bowlers is a sign of a great clubman.
- The OCC committee, the work you did to ensure we got the season going in a pandemic should not go unnoticed. I'm sure there was a lot of meetings with plenty of rules and regulations but to be able to play a full season was a credit to all concerned.


FIFTH XI REPORT 2020/21

J.G. CRAIG U15 TURF TEAM 2020/21 - PREMIERS!

Each year the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA) runs the J.G. Craig Competition for Under 15 cricket players. It is recognised as the premier Under 15 cricket competition in Victoria and is conducted in January each year. All 28 sub-district clubs enter a team.

The competition was known as the R M Hatch Competition for more than 50 years but in 2014/15 it was re-named the J G Craig Competition after Ormond and VSDCA legend, John Craig. John scored more than 7,000 runs in the VSDCA and was part of 6 premierships at Ormond. As such, the club has a special connection with the competition and the club has enjoyed great success in the competition over recent years having won it in 2007/08,



2016/17 and again in 2017/18. We were also runners up in 2008/09 and semi- finalists in 2005/2006, 2006/2007 and 2013/14. The club was also quarter-finalists in 2010/2011 and again this 2019/20 season. We can now add this season's premiership in 2020/21, our third in the last five seasons.

We have historically fielded a team that is a combination of the best current Ormond junior under 15 players together with juniors from other clubs from all over Victoria.

We started planning for the competition very early, although COVID-19 made it very difficult with lockdowns and restrictions in place. We managed to get some sessions in and conducted a winter training programme as part of the talent identification process. After an extended lockdown we finalised our squad based on the winter sessions we had in May and June. We then started training again in October with the tournament to go ahead as planned in January. We were very confident that we had assembled a strong team with very good batting and bowling depth. We had a practice match in December against the Frankston Under 16 Dowling team where we had a convincing win which was a great effort as they are a year older. A brilliant unbeaten century from Captain Harry DeMattia was very exciting to watch as it came off only 70 balls.

Moving into January, we had a mixed bag of weather to deal with in week 1 of the tournament. Lots of rain around but due to the excellent work and commitment by Paul, our curator, John Craig himself and all the coaches we managed to get the pitch ready between all the showers and we were ready to host Elsternwick in round 1. The game was reduced to 32 overs a side and we restricted Elsternwick to 8/70 with Lucas Bremner taking 2/10 off his 6 overs. We then batted our overs and made 4/159 with Harry DeMattia making 66 and Sam Gove 33no.

Round 2 we played Moorabbin again at home. Batting first we made 8/203. Harry DeMattia with 72, Kyle Parrott 36 and Harry Wallace 31 the top scorers. Another great performance with the ball and in the field with 2 wickets each to Harry Wallace, Senin Seymour and Dinal Gamage bowling out Moorabbin for 77. An amazing catch from Jack Mannix at square leg was certainly a highlight.

Round 3 and we hosted Malvern. A brilliant effort in the field saw us bowl Malvern out for 69. Three wickets to Lucas Bremner and 2 each to Phoenix Chivers, Senin Seymour and Harry Wallace. On a difficult pitch we then batted the overs for 6/136, Sam Gove with 44 and Dinal Gamage with 30 the best with the bat.

Round 4 we headed on the road to Oakleigh where we batted first and made 4/198. Harry DeMattia with 62no, Kyle Parrott with 51 and Mitch Kirkwood-Scott with 40 the best with the bat. Another brilliant bowling performance saw us keep Oakleigh to 6/96 off their 40 overs. Wickets were shared around with Jack Mannix taking 2.

Round 5 we had a bye as we moved onto round 6 against arch-rival Brighton in a top of the table clash at the Gunn. Bowling first we managed to restrict Brighton to 3/148. We bowled tight and steady without taking many wickets but were confident of chasing down the runs. And chase down the runs we did as we past the score with over 10 overs remaining and went on to make 5/192. Again the skipper, Harry DeMattia lead from the front with an unbeaten 64 and a dashing 60 off 55 balls from wicket-keeper and opening batsman Mitch Kirkwood-Scott the standout. A nice 26 from our other opener Charlie Costa was also a highlight. A great all round performance from the boys.

A brilliant home and away series ended with the boys going through to the finals unbeaten on top of the ladder with a massive percentage of 3.29.

We were without our captain Harry DeMattia for the first 2 finals and our Vice Captains, Christian Howe and Kyle Parrott took charge of the team. Harry was selected in the Victorian Under 17 side which was an amazing effort for an Under 15 player and something everyone at Ormond was extremely proud of Harry for achieving. Despite Harry's absence, we were still extremely confident of getting the job done given our talented squad and incredible depth.

QUARTER FINAL was against Box Hill at the Gunn. We found ourselves in the field first and bowled and fielded extremely well. Christian Howe the pick of the bowlers with 2 wickets. Everyone bowled well but it was a stunning display of fielding by the boys, with 5 run outs. Mitch Kirkwood-Scott was involved in all 5 of the run outs and we then had to bat for 6 overs before lunch and our positive game style was on display as we went to lunch at 0/39. Our aggressive nature continued after lunch with a brilliant 115 run partnership between openers Mitch Kirkwood-Scott and Charlie Costa. Mitch with a blistering 73 off 63 balls and Charlie a steady 32. We passed Box Hill in just 24 overs and won the game at 2/129.

SEMI FINAL was again at home against Coburg. We fielded first and again the boys bowled and fielded the house down. Christian Howe was superb with the new ball taking 3/21 and Sam Gove finished off the innings with 3/29. We needed to chase down 127 for a spot in the grand final and after a shaky start at 2/0 a steady partnership between Kyle Parrott 33 and Sam Gove 17 got us back on top but when they both fell we were 4/57 with the game in the balance. Enter Christian Howe and Harry Wallace as the boys played without fear and blasted us into the grand final with Christian making 42no and Harry 29no which saw us chase down the total at 4/129 with 10 overs remaining.

GRAND FINAL was against Plenty Valley at Elsternwick Park. We welcomed back our captain for the game and after losing the toss, surprisingly, Plenty Valley sent us into bat. We got off to a good start with a great platform of 3/118 with 15 overs left but after losing 4 quick wickets we needed the lower order to bat well, which they did with style. An 8th wicket partnership of 62 runs between Jack Mannix and Dinal Gamage steered us up to 8/200 with Jack making 38no and Dinal 22no. Earlier captain Harry DeMattia was brilliant with his innings of 64 and Mitch Kirkwood-Scott made a brisk 21.

It was a big total and the opening spells from Christian Howe and Lucas Bremner set the tone and along with some amazing fielding from Sam Gove we had Plenty Valley in early trouble at 2/12. The key wicket of Plenty Valley star Oliver Peake was crucial and after getting an early life where we thought we had him caught behind, he was then bowled by Harry DeMattia in what was one of the quickest spells ever seen in an Under 15 competition. Wickets then continued to fall regularly with Jack Mannix capping off his brilliant day and man of the match performance with 3/17. Two wickets to Senin Seymour, and the job was done, Plenty Valley all out for 89 and the JG Craig premiership was back at Ormond for the third time in 5 years.

A simply amazing tournament from the squad as we won all 9 games and were the most deserving premiers. I can't thank the players enough, the way they embraced the tournament was a credit to all involved. It was so good to see them all develop their games and learn more about what they are capable of in such a fun and supportive environment. 



TREASURER'S REPORT 2020/21

TREASURER'S REPORT

Following profit of \$10,437 in the prior year, the Ormond Cricket Club is very happy to be reporting another profit of \$2,892 for season 2020/21. After a season that was subject to reduced playing time and COVID-19 restrictions around use of the clubrooms for social and fundraising events, this financial result was an achievement in itself. The success of the club on field, culminating in it hosting the 1st XI grand final, was a major contributor to this financial result.

It should be noted that both the current year and prior year profits include a non-cash write-down in the value of equipment on hand of \$1,902 and \$2,412 respectively. Additionally, the profit this season was also impacted negatively by a write down of \$875 to the value of the investment in the Ormond / McKinnon branch of the Bendigo Bank, following its closure and sale to the Murrumbeena community branch. The Club received 65c in the dollar back from its original investment of \$2,500. Notwithstanding the loss made, the Club has been the beneficiary of significant financial support over the last ten years, and we look forward to building a new relationship in the community with the Murrumbeena branch.

Total income has decreased from \$88,177 to \$87,107. The key drivers of this decrease were from a significant reduction in income from social and fundraising activities as well as from sponsorship and donations. This decrease was partially offset by an increase in income from grants, sale of merchandise and prizemoney. The negative impact of the reduction in social and fundraising activities would have been even worse had the club not experienced success on the field.

Overall, cricket club expenditure increased in season 2020/21 by \$6,475. There were four key drivers of change in our expenditure – an additional senior team led to an increase in equipment and balls; the club invested heavily in coaching of its junior teams; increased money spent on club apparel (offset by increased sales income); and the overall success of the club, coupled with the ability to conduct presentation events, led to increased expenditure on trophies and awards. These cost increases were partially offset by reduced costs of indoor training, afternoon teas, donations (due to not having held the annual Pink Stumps Day event) and utilities. The club was also fortunate to have been supported well through the impact of COVID-19 by Glen Eira Council, who waived all ground, pavilion and utilities charges for the season.

The Club has built up a strong cash position, which has been further strengthened this season and now sits in excess of \$50,000. The club has committed to investing some of this in improving its pitch covering equipment for the coming season.

Ormond Cricket Club enjoys a strong ongoing relationship with its sponsors, and the financial contributions of The Door Store, Omegapharm, Buxton Real Estate, Cricket HQ and The Servery deserve to be highlighted. The Club also wishes to thank those very generous people and businesses who sponsored a player during the season.

I would like to acknowledge the support of John Craig and Mathew Cousins in administering the Club's financial matters, as well as thanking Will Robertshaw for his hard work to drive the prompt payments from players for subscriptions and merchandise purchases.

With the inherent uncertainty at play related to the global pandemic, Ormond Cricket Club is extremely well positioned financially to ride whatever waves continue to come its way. We enjoy the foundation of having a strong cash reserve, along with being debt free, and along with the commitment of a group of hard-working volunteers, we are in great shape for season 2021/22.
